We, the undersigned, have this day voluntarily associated ourselves together for the purpose of forming a non-profit corporation and do hereby adopt the following Articles of Incorporation:

ARTICLE I

The name of this corporation is:

International Traditional Karate Federation

ARTICLE II

This corporation is a non-profit mutual benefit corporation organized under the Non-Profit Mutual Benefit Corporation Law. The purpose of this corporation is to engage in any lawful activity for which a corporation may be organized under such law.

ARTICLE III

The specific purposes for which the corporation is formed are:

- a) to promote cordial and friendly relations among its members and to supervise Traditional Karate activities all over the world;
- b) to protect the interests of Traditional Karate throughout the world;
- c) to organize Traditional Karate throughout the world and to develop and promulgate the techniques and spirit of the Karate-do (way of Traditional Karate);
- d) to establish the international technical rules of Traditional Karate;
- e) to organize world Traditional Karate championships in collaboration with the member federations and continental unions. The right to organize official world championships and other international events shall be granted only to such countries as are able to receive all the participants on their territories;
- f) to have Traditional Karate accepted in the Olympic Games and all other Continental Games.

The foregoing statement of purposes shall be construed as a statement of both purposes and powers, and the purposes and powers stated in each clause shall, except where otherwise expressed, be in no way limited or restricted by any reference to or inference from the terms or provisions of any other clause, but shall be regarded as independent purposes and powers and nothing contained in the foregoing statement of purposes shall be construed to authorize this corporation to carry on any activity for the profit of its members, or to distribute any gains, profits or dividends to any of its members as such, except upon dissolution or winding up.

ARTICLE IV

The principal office for the transaction of business of the corporation is to be located in the County of Los Angeles, State of California.

ARTICLE V

The names and addresses of the three (3) persons who are to act in the capacity of directors until the selection of their successors, and who shall be known as trustees, are as follows:

The existence of this corporation shall commence with the filing of these Articles of Incorporation in accordance with law and shall thereafter be perpetual.

ARTICLE VIII

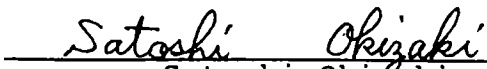

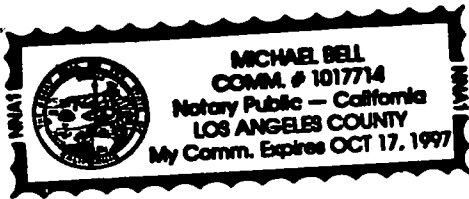
